Urgent action required as the DOJ is currently reviewing the legality of CA claw machines – CEMA represents California stakeholders and now needs your support.

Operators, FEC owners, manufacturers, distributors and suppliers would all be affected.

Claw machines are under threat—and so is your business.

In 2010, California's Bureau of Gambling Control (BGC) claimed **all claw machines are illegal gambling devices**. But that opinion is outdated and doesn't reflect how today's machines actually work.

We need your voice to help protect skill-based and ticket-dispensing claw machines—a vital part of family entertainment centers across the state.

of California Law Allows Skill-Based Games

Under **Penal Code § 330b(f)**, machines that rely on skill—like skeeball and basketball—are legal. Claw machines that require precision, timing, and practice fall into the same category.

© Gambling = Chance, Not Skill

- For a machine to be gambling under CA law, it must:
- Be a device
- Require payment to play
- Award prizes based on chance

Modern claw machines reward SKILL, not chance.
